KTI TO BE DISSOLVED

At the EGM in January it was decided that, after 9 years of four quarterly Local Produce Markets a year, solar panels on the Community Centre roof, the allotments and numerous smaller initiatives involving the primary schools, Scouts, tennis club and various information evenings, Kingsley Transition Initiative would be dissolved, mainly because the existing team felt that we had done as much as could be achieved.

At the January Parish Council meeting, KTI reported that their current funds are in excess of £2000 and that it is the intention of KTI, when all liabilities have been met, to pass remaining funds to the Parish council Community Fund.


Kingsley Bookworms – Next meeting 2nd February 2017 at the Red Bull

Kingsley & Newton Village Institute

An extensive refurbishment of the Village Institute building is taking place thanks to a £32,830 grant from funding body WREN.

The money, awarded by WREN's FCC Community Action Fund, will be used to provide a new gas-fired central heating system; an electrical upgrade throughout the building; loft and cavity wall insulation; replacement of the roofline, and new windows and doors throughout. All of this will improve energy efficiency at the Institute.

It is hoped that the improved facilities will be in use by the 2017 May Bank Holiday.

WREN is a not-for-profit business that awards grants for community, conservation and heritage projects from funds donated by FCC Environment (the leading UK waste and resource management company) through the Landfill Communities Fund. Since 1998, WREN has granted over £200m to more than 7,000 projects which benefit people living within 10 miles of a FCC Environment landfill site. Kingsley Walking Group



The first walk of the year was a rewarding seven miler, from Norton Priory through Halton Village. Much of the route was surprisingly rural, through pleasant woodland and along the canalside. We took lunch below the walls of Halton Castle, which afforded good views of the Mersey Gateway project and the developing bridge. Walking through Halton, we got a sense of the village as it was in a bygone age, passing The Seneschal's House, reputedly the oldest house in Runcorn (c 1598). Eleven of us turned out, despite the unpromising weather, and thankfully the rain held off.

The walk started at the Hare and Hounds Crowton on a bright sunny day . We enjoyed walking on the bridle ways and footpaths around Crowton and Norley stopping off to have our coffee in a friends garden. There were long views of the Cheshire countryside from the elevated paths with buzzards soaring close by. There were 22 people on the walk which was just over 5 miles. Sharing a meal together at the end.

Kingsley Walking Group have two walks each month: on the second Tuesday there is a long walk of 7 - 8.5 miles (bring a packed lunch); on the last Wednesday a short walk of approximately 5 miles with a coffee break and pub lunch. We meet at the Community Centre at 9.30am for the short walks and for the long walks in January and February. Note however an earlier start time of 9.00am for the long walks from March to November.

Kingsley Parish Council Meeting 17 January 2017

Members of the Public. Four members of the public attended the meeting.

Planning applications. Two planning applications were received and discussed at the meeting. Planning Application 16/05436/FUL Manor Cottage Hillfoot Lane Kingsley demolition of existing structures and two storey rear extension. 16/05249/FUL 2 Westbrook Road Kingsley replacement & repositioning of 2 metre fence.

Playing Field. Tenders have gone out to contractors for work required on certain trees within the playing field. Lights in the field are being repaired.

Car Parking. A Car Parking Working Group is being set up in order to continue to look at ways to improve car parking within the village. The working group will initially consist of Parish Councillors though when other expertise is required specialists will be invited to join the Group.

Contractors have been confirmed for 2017, to carry out the grass cutting in the playing field, works along the public rights of way and grass cutting in the cemetery.

Kingsley Transiton Initiative (KTI). Unfortunately KTI is officially closing down as public support appears to be petering out. KTI have been in existence since 2009 and have managed several projects during that time including placing solar panels on the Community Centre, setting up the Monthly Market and the Allotments as well as assisting with school projects and sponsoring the Tennis Club. Sadly it means the end of the monthly market unless someone comes forward to run it.
