# Nature Notes

— DELAMERE —

Cheshire Wildlife Trust update us on the wonderful habitat restoration taking place on your doorstep to help some of Cheshire's rarest wildlife



In July of this year Delamere Conservation Officer Chris Meredith and volunteers visited Natural England managed National Nature Reserves, Chartley Moss, and Fenns, Whixall and Bettesfield Mosses, for the last time in this phase of the white-faced darter reintroduction project.

As part of the project to reintroduce the white-faced darter dragonfly to Delamere the team collected sphagnum moss, which contains eggs deposited by this rare dragonfly, to move to the reintroduction site at Doolittle Moss, Delamere. Before the moss could be re-located, volunteers painstakingly searched through it to remove predatory animals such as spiders and large dragonfly larvae to give the eggs and recently hatched larvae the best chance of survival.

It is hoped this final egg introduction will give the Delamere population an extra boost before the next 3 years of monitoring.

We're pleased to say that after undertaking surveys on two of our reserves, Black Lake and Abbots Moss, we

can confirm that scitticus floricola is still present and thriving on both sites. This small but striking jumping spider has only been found on a handful of mossland sites across the UK and has a particularly liking for setting up home in cotton-grass seedheads. Many thanks to Richard Gallon from the British Arachnological Society for providing his skill and expertise to carry out these surveys.

Delamere's Dragons Development Officer Heather Hulse and trainee Margaret Warren teamed up with local wildlife photographer Ron in June for a wild day shooting on the mosses of Delamere. Armed with cameras, a group of enthusiastic amateur photographers braved the downpours to visit Delamere's mosslands to capture the unique wildlife and habitat found there. This photo of Doolittle Moss was sent in from Maggie Bullock who attended the day.

## **Kingsley Parish Council - Community Fund**

At the July meeting of Kingsley Parish Council, council members voted in favour of creating a Community Fund. This will be a community scheme whereby a limited sum of money will be set aside by the Parish Council on an annual basis dependent upon the demands on the Parish Council budget to meet designated projects and statutory requirements within the village. The value of the fund may vary from year to year.

Community Groups and organisations will be able to apply for grants as long as the scheme or project is for the sole benefit of residents, families and the wider community of Kingsley.

The Scheme will be run on a one year trial basis to determine if it is viable financially and to determine if there is sufficient interest within the community. The Scheme will be open for applications from the 1st November this year (2016) and the deadline for applications will close on the 31st January 2017. Full details will be available from the Parish Clerk on the 1st November, **please do not contact the Parish Clerk before this date.**

There will be a minimum value application of £25 and a maximum application of £1,000.00. Successful applicants will be notified by 31st March 2017 and the value of the final grants awarded will depend upon the number of applications received and the amount of money available within the Council budget determined at the Budget Meeting in December.

In August we talked about “Villette” by Charlotte Bronte to celebrate 200 years since her birth. Although we were a bit wary of reading a “classic”, everyone agreed that the book was intriguing.
