Last autumn term we were all very busy here at Kingsley St John's. After an exciting first half term, involving trips to the Weaver Hall Museum for a fun packed activity day all about the Vikings and a trip to Norley CE to most with the author Rachel Lindsay who inspired the children to write creatively, Class 2 returned after half term once again get involved in a varied programme of events and activities.



School Display
The theme was 'Space' and Class 2 undertook a large scale DT project to build a 3D spaceman. It was a whole class effort and the children worked together well. Firstly, they had to mould newspaper to make nultiple part sections of the body.

These sections were secured together to build up the life sized model. After this came the messy bit! Once the papier mache had dried our spaceman was ready to paint. Finally the astronaut's limbs were held in place using wooden dowels.



Frodsham Advent Calendar

The children thoroughly enjoyed making this years window display box, in which they worked either individually or in pairs to create a miniature 3D Christmas scene out of craft materials. Each scene was joined together. Fairy lights were then placed behind and shone through to make a truly spectacular seasonal display. Did you find it?

Hailey Poems

This Spring term the children have been connecting with nature to inspire thoughts and stir up feelings for their poetry writing. The whole of Class 2 wrote their own poems in the style of Haiku with some Y4s keeping to the traditional rules of a specific syllable count per line. The class have word processed their poems in ICT in preparation for our next type of poetry 'Calligrams'. They have been experimenting with word art to create a visual image using written words ready to use in their calligram poems. We plan to use a software application to publish Class 2's poems at the end of the unit.

EDWARD RALPH STUBBS 28.11.1918 to 24.12.2011

Edward did not have the easiest of starts in life, but he did have fond memories of those he knew in & around Kingsley & Norley.

He was adopted into The Stubbs family and spent an "idyllic" childhood, as he often recalled, in the heart of Delamere Forest at Woodman's Lodge. It was a large family in a small house; yet they were carefree days, even though he had to walk great distances, in all weathers, to the little school at Norley, just across from the Church. And when he went to a different school, at Manley, nothing changed except the direction of travel!

I am telling you this second-hand, yet if you were growing up at the same time as my father you will recognise things like fetching the water daily in buckets from a spring and walking across fields dripping wet with shiny dew to fetch the milk straight from the farm, and the trouble you'd be in if you'd spilt any.

I could, and probably should, fill a book with the tales of characters that he knew at school, later at work at Kingsley Mill and Crowton Mill, local farmers and customers that came into his shopnow Brow Cottages on Town Well...(this was after he returned from wartime service in the RAF as a reconnaissance photographer).

You may have bought newspapers from him - or delivered them for him. If you remember those times then you will know who those characters were and save me from possible libel by mentioning names! Suffice it to say that if the rest of us imagine a mix between characters from Dickens and those from 'Heartbeat' (The odd 'Greengrass' & 'Bernie Scripps' in there).

Still, long story short: After meeting and marrying my mother, Marjorie, who was a nurse at Hefferstone Grange, the couple, together with my older brother David, left Kingsley and lived in Germany for some time, when Eddie spent a further period in the RAF.

Upon his return they made their home in Newton-le-Willows, where Marjorie's family was based...I came along and Dad began a 23 year career in teaching, travelling daily to Salford.

In a long retirement, much of this a widower (Mum sadly died at just 62), he enjoyed gardening & painting and some Kingsley & Norley folk may well own a picture of his.

After much relocation he spent his final years in Spurstow, and sadly following a lengthy illness passed away at home on Christmas Eve 2011.

Those who knew him will, I hope remember a caring and intelligent Gentleman, and to those he knew, I must thank you all, for you are the people who shaped him in those early years and made him the man that I am proud to call my father.

I found it helpful to learn which plants are happy to grow up close against a wall but don't need a trellis or wires, and which need full support. Clematis must have something to "grab" hold of, but wisteria can use a mainframe, for example. Richard also warned of some plants which will "take over" given half a chance, and others that should not be too happy if you want them to flower (summer jasmine).

Richard's enthusiasm and expertise came through in his lovely pictures as well as his presentation. He was also happy to answer questions both at the end and during the talk.

FARM UPDATE JANUARY 2011

NEWS & VIEWS FROM YOUR LOCAL FAMILY FARM

So far, the wet and windy winter continues. After two consecutive hard winters, we are back to more normal winters for these Islands. The exceptionally mild weather has meant spring bulbs have grown earlier this year. The first snowdrop came out in our garden on 4th January and the daffodils in Dark Lane were out just after Christmas.

Wheat plants are a dark green colour and seem to be taking up nitrogen. This is too early really, but nature always has a way of evening things up: so maybe there will be a cold snap in February. Next years seed potatoes have arrived, and are boxed up in trays and stored in the barns. All the cattle are inside, not this year to keep them warm, but to stop the fields, which are very wet, from being poached and damaged too much.

The price of wheat for next year is up and down like a fiddlers elbow! There is plenty of wheat around the world this year forcing the price down, but there is a shortage of maize. Maize, in North America, is mainly used in bio fuels and animal feeds, but droughts and frosts during the growing season have reduced potential yields. Therefore wheat is being used instead of maize pushing the price up.

The euro crisis seems to have died down over Christmas, probably because the bankers and politicians have taken a month's holiday!! Seriously though, if the eurozone should break up, it would cause havoc for farmers. Time will tell.

For some time now, I have been meaning to write about the criminal waste of good food in this country. Consumers are completely confused about the assortment of sell-by, use-by, display-by and consume-by dates on products. All these dates do is encourage the consumer to throw out good food they

perceive as being past its best. Supermarkets are quite happy with us throwing out edible food because we will go and buy some more from them. According to a recent report the average family dumps £680 worth of good food each year. Around one fifth of all food bought by households is dumped. Fruit, vegetables, dairy products and other perishables such as bread and meat are the most likely items to be thrown away. This totals 7.2 million tonnes of food a year worth £12 billion. The food waste mountain is enough to fill Wembley Stadium nine times over.

Some interesting food facts include:

All the world's nearly one billion hungry people could be lifted out of malnourishment on less than a quarter of the food that is wasted in the US, UK and Europe.

An estimated 20 to 40% of UK fruit and vegetables are rejected even before they reach the shops – mostly because they do not match the supermarkets excessively strict cosmetic standards.


The bread and other cereal products thrown away in UK households alone would have been enough to lift 30 million of the world's hungry people out of malnourishment.

10% of rich countries greenhouse gas emissions come from growing food that is never eaten.

The irrigation water used globally to grow food that is wasted would be enough for the domestic needs (at 200 L per person per day) of 9 billion people – the number expected on the planet in 2050! FOOD FOR THOUGHT.


