EDITORIAL NEWS AND VIEWS

Dear Readers

Recently there have been several cases of fraud, both online and by phone. Below is an extract taken from the Police report which has useful information on how to protect yourself from this type of crime.

There have been two serious attempted fraud offences, whereby offenders have phoned potential victims, persuaded them that they need to make a payment for some unsolicited service and then requested bank details to collect payment. Residents should NEVER respond to unexpected calls which request personal information, bank details or remote access to a computer!

A large number of the shed and garage burglaries reported over recent months, involve the theft of expensive mountain bikes. It is notable that the offenders appear able to target those garages which contain such expensive bikes. Without divulging specific details, I would urge people who post photos of themselves enjoying days out, on social media sites such as Facebook or Instagram, to review their security settings, in order to prevent offenders from gathering digital information stored within the photo and using this to identify where the owner (and therefore the bike) live. All readers should be aware that a lot of personal information which you may be unaware of, is made available on social media sites, especially when posting photos, UNLESS you take care to just navigate to the menu of the app, go to 'Settings' and then select the security settings that you wish to put in place.

Due to the Community Governance Review, a number of properties have transferred to the Parish of Frodsham. This may ultimately effect the pre-cept.

Early discussions are under way to decide on an improvement plan for the land at the top end of Dark Lane. This is likely to be a planting scheme.

It was agreed the Council would take advantage of the Quality Council's free 1 year subscription.

The Village Institute AGM is being held on February 11th at the Community Centre. We would like as many people as possible to attend.

It was noted there have been a number of complaints about the village pavements/paths. Any issues need to be raised direct with Cheshire West and Chester Council. This can be done by one of the following methods:

Banish the winter blues with a visit to Kingsley Players' new February stage production, *A Pack of Three one act comedies*.

The Players promise to deal their audience a winning hand in this new performance slot with a trio of rib-tickling comedic plays, staged for four nights at Kingsley Community Centre, **Wednesday 25th to Saturday 28th February, 7.30pm.**

The evening will open with *Two Wits to Woo* by John Kelly, directed by Sandra Capper. Widowed Lady Winsome is being hoodwinked by her chauffeur who runs a taxi business and gardener who profits from her produce. She wants to sell her ailing estate and the pair are having none of it. But she is not quite as naïve as they think....

Completing the first half is a short comedy classic, made famous by the comedian Rowan Atkinson. *The Sneeze* by Anton Chekhov, (translated and adapted by Michael Frayn) is directed by Lynn Pegler. She says: "Anyone who associates Chekhov purely with tearful tragedies will be surprised and delighted with this uproarious comic jewel. In a piece of sublime Russian slapstick, a minor government official sneezes on a very important government official during a trip to the theatre. Bring your hankies just to catch the laughter."

After the interval, *Caught on the Hop* by David Foxton, directed by Jo Oultram, completes the trio. This hilarious French farce opens with society lady Sophie Fontaineau who returns home early after a rendezvous with her lover. She is surprised to watch her husband Etienne enter disguised as the hunchback of Notre Dame and the plot then sparkles with enough comic twists to send the audience searching for their hankies again.

Western Rural Round-up- Week ending 11/01/2015

Please note that the local police station 0845 telephone numbers are not staffed 24 hours a day and that there may be some delay in responding to any messages left.

There have been three thefts from building sites reported this week – some from large housing estates and also from individual building developments. One offence was reported On Monday in Frodsham and the other two were both reported on Friday, one in Tarvin and the other in Sandiway. It is likely that the offenders made off empty handed when they were disturbed at one of these locations, when a concerned nearby resident reported a suspicious van reversed up to the gates. Vulnerable building sites attract offenders who will keep returning. Extra vigilance from local residents helps to deter potential offenders. Please continue to phone in about any suspicious behaviour.

There have been two shed/garage breaks this week in Helsby. Both occurred overnight. One of these was made easy for the offenders, as a door was left unlocked. There have been a small number of similar offences in Helsby over recent weeks. Please make sure that you lock all sheds and garages and that locks & hinges are strong and fitted to prevent being tampered with.

Also in Helsby, a Land Rover Discovery was stolen on Tuesday. This kind of vehicle is quite specialised, favoured in Rural communities. There have been other offences this week, not in Helsby, but of rural interest. Fencing keeping livestock in fields has been cut near Bickerton. This may be related to disputes over access to rights of way, but cutting fences which allows livestock to wander onto roads is clearly very dangerous. Police are investigating this matter. In Mouldsworth, a bullock has been stolen from a secure field. Again, police are following up lines of enquiry.

On Wednesday, two males were disturbed breaking into a business premises near Dodleston. Thanks to the prompt call to police and good descriptions by the victim, both males were detained and arrested whilst trying to make their escape.

FARM UPDATE - WINTER - JANUARY 2015

NEWS & VIEWS FROM YOUR LOCAL FAMILY FARM

Autumn came in September and it really was the “Season of Mists and Mellow Fruitfulness”. Ideal growing weather has meant massive crops of fruits: apples, pears, plums and damsons. While huge bunches of blackberries hung in the hedgerows. We have gathered lots of sloes from the blackthorn plant to put in our sloe gin for Christmas. Very good it is too - hic!

When the frustrating wet and soggy August ended, September brought an Indian Summer: glorious sunny days meant harvest could resume and was finally completed on 10th September. The wheat and barley was cut dry enough to store without drying. Yields have been OK but not much better than average. Potato yields have been very good due to ideal growing conditions: rain and hot sun, then more rain. But big yields mean low prices. Prices for all farm products have crashed this year for various reasons. There has been a huge harvest in the USA, record yields of soya, maize (corn) and wheat have driven down prices, and ironically, after the huge success of fracking, there is a surplus of gas in the USA, so the millions of tons of maize and wheat that went into ethanol production and bio-diesel for fuel, is now on the market depressing prices. There have been good harvests in all the main wheat producing areas of the world, Australia, Argentina and Russia/Ukraine. Russia has been a strong seller of wheat out of Ukraine. Black sea wheat, as it is called, is always priced to sell, meaning it is always the cheapest, so pulls down the price.

When last December, Russia put a tax on wheat exports because they were worried they would not have enough wheat to see them through the winter, the price started to rise for next years harvest.

Russia's game of cat and mouse with the West continued, when during August last year, it imposed a one year blanket ban of all fruit, veg, meat, fish, milk and dairy imports from the US, EU, Australia and Norway with immediate effect. Whereas the UK exports very little to Russia, other EU members export a lot. So all these products will be circulating all around Europe trying to find a home, therefore depressing prices further.

All our products have seen prices sharply depressed this year for various reasons. Beef cattle prices were down £200 per head in the summer. This is due to the £ strengthening against the euro: making beef imports cheaper, mainly from Eastern Europe and Poland. Though now the price has started to improve.

Oil seed rape prices are down £100 per tonne on last year due to a record harvest worldwide, and less demand for biofuels.

Potatoes – where to start – The worst year I can remember! Huge yields due to ideal growing conditions and slow demand from consumers. We couldn't give our potatoes away in the Autumn, so we fed a lot to our beef cattle: they love them! The Potato Council estimate there is a surplus of 1 million tonnes of potatoes this year in Britain.

Milk price down 7/10p a litre. This is about a 30% drop: due to a 5% increase in production this year because of ideal grass growing conditions. Plus the Russian ban has led to a huge surplus. Thomas Ultram explained very clearly in last month's Kingsley News how the price cut would affect him and his family.

ANYWAY, enough of moaning about last year! We must look forward to this year. Farmers are nothing, if not optimistic. So this year has got to be better. We have past the equinox now, the days are getting longer, and Spring is just around the corner. Daffodils are poking through, and the countryside will soon burst into life.

IN REPLY TO THOMAS OULTRAM ARTICLE

I agree with a lot of the facts stated in the letter signed by Thomas Oultram concerning two of the large supermarket's milk purchasing agreements. However it should not go without a mention that several others have similar schemes in place Waitrose, M&S, Booths & the Co-operative.

The Co-operative dairy group comprises of just over 200 farm members who are paid around 30.5 pence per litre of milk. The group was formed in August 2011 when we were fortunate enough to obtain a contract to supply through our primary milk buyer Muller-Wiseman Dairies.

Herds must be officially milk recorded monthly, somatic cell count below 250,000. Each cow must be locomotion scored at least twice a year (does the cow walk with even weight bearing and rhythm on all four feet). A bit like strictly come dancing! Each cow must be body condition scored annually by a vet or suitably qualified professional. When and where possible cows should have access to grazing.

Local business group meetings are held around 3 times a year on different members farms. Members need to ensure a key staff member or proprietor attends scheduled meetings during the year. Meetings are professionally facilitated by a dedicated consultant who will bring in an appropriate speaker depending on the focus (a vet, nutritionist or building specialist).

The aims and objectives being to improve animal welfare, sustainability and herd efficiency

Deviations from these requirements would lead to suspension from the CDG.

Meetings are funded by the Co-op along with a good lunch provided.

To close I will take an extract from our chairman's report Ian Speed who some of you may know.

"As far as I am concerned the Co-operative are fully supporting British farmers at a time when we all need it most. The CDG was set up as a forerunner to other Co-op producer protein groups with a focus on food security, sustainability and to streamline efficiencies from farm to customers. We all need each other in good times as well as bad".


