Kingsley Parish Council

Following on from our update in December's Kingsley News, the Parish Council has been continuing with undertaking our statutory duties. We have managed to secure the tenure of our Locum Clerk on a 6 month contract whilst we advertise and interview for a full time replacement Parish Clerk. We are taking advice from CHALC and NALC on the recruitment process and drawing up detailed job specification, the Parish Clerk is also the Responsible Financial Officer so must be suitably qualified and hold SILCA qualifications, be familiar with NPPF, have experience with Planning Applications, Neighbourhood Plans, writing grant bids and other tasks that will be outlined in the new job specification.

We have had one formal application in writing with supporting biographic details and at the January Parish Council meeting the person was formally co-opted onto the council. He will be summonsed to attend at the February meeting. Should anyone wish to apply for one of the remaining Councillor vacancies please email the Parish Clerk Luke Trevaskis for an application pack.

At the January meeting the Parish Council agreed the new Budget for 2021/22 and set the new precept. Tenders for Grounds Maintenance were discussed and contractors appointed for the Cemetery, Playing Field and Public Rights of Way.

The Parish Council has been in regular contact with Torus Housing, and handouts are now available on the imminent sale of the properties on Higher Heyes, these can be picked up from the Co-op, Forresters, Charity Shop and Chemist if you have not already had one through your doors. This is your opportunity as residents of Kingsley to have advance purchasing rights to these properties, this can apply to members of your family, people working in Kingsley or have a direct Kingsley connection. Details are also available on the Parish Council website, Kingsley Village website and the Kingsley Facebook page.

The Parish Council have also raised with Cheshire West through our Borough Councillor the water course that is now running down the footpath on Hollow Lane from Top School to the Cemetery. Our Borough Councillor has agreed to chase Street Scene to get them out to investigate and to stop the leak or divert the natural ground water. We have also stated that the path is broken up and is extremely dangerous for children and parents walking to and from Top School or those residents wishing to go for a walk.

We have been working with CWAC in the past few days to review the location and condition of the Grit bins around the village which have been in use in recent weeks. The Chair of the Council did a survey and visited all the bins identified to us by CWAC. We identified a broken bin on the corner of Acres Crescent and we are advised that this has now been replaced.

It's been a quiet year for local live theatre but Kingsley Players have many plans for your entertainment once COVID restrictions start to lift. We already have in production and rehearsal (thanks to modern technology) several shows which we know you will enjoy.

We have postponed the two one act plays due to be staged at Kingsley Community Centre at the end of January and beginning of February but we are optimistic that they will go ahead soon using social distancing measures for both the cast and the audience: a new entertaining, drama for adults, **Alice's Quest for Wonderland: Down the Rabbit Hole with Lewis Carroll**, by writer/director, Lynn Pegler and **TWO**, a bitter sweet comedy set in a pub, by Jim Cartwright, directed by Tom Hayes, featuring Neil Silcock and Sue Elliott. As both these productions have small casts, our plan is to re-stage them when Cheshire moves back into Tier 2 level restrictions or lower.

Also waiting in the wings is a production of the wonderful Alan Ayckbourn comedy **How the Other Half Loves**, directed by Malcolm Barker. Our hope is to be able to stage this later in the spring season.

Our charity fund-raising tour of 'Allo 'Allo in March has been pushed back to November, when our biannual tours will start again.

Kingsley Players Youth Theatre, led by the amazing Jake Powell, is going digital with online performances of their award-winning production, **Chatroom**, Enda Walsh's hard-hitting play about manipulation, cyberbullying and adolescent insecurity. Don't miss this brilliant production which can be viewed on Friday 26 and Saturday 27 February, 7.30pm, at a cost of £10 per household, including a donation to POPYRUS: Prevention of Youth Suicide. Looking further ahead, we will be planning for a musical/panto January 2022 (if you'd like to join us for all the fun of the musical, please come along when we announce read throughs and audition); and we have two popular plays (Funny Money and Hobson's Choice) also in the pipeline.

In the meantime, we are delighted to welcome the new extension to our theatrical home at Kingsley Community Centre. The Players contributed £6,000 towards the cost, saved up from several years of box office revenue. The new flexible side room will provide much-needed dressing rooms during production weeks and will mean we won't need to inconvenience other groups using the centre as much.

And three cheers, actors won't need to run outside from the foyer to the emergency door during the cold and rain to access the stage door onto the set anymore!

Kingsley Community Centre – Update

Due to the current national lock down we have sadly had no option but to close the centre. The centre will reopen as soon as it is deemed safe to do so and taking account of all the latest government guidance. Since the summer, the centre has been utilised and we have had a number of groups and activities regularly taking place. I would like to express our thanks to all the organisers who have diligently followed the Covid safety measures and also importantly to all those participants who felt able to continue to use the centre.

To ensure the centre remains Covid-19 Secure and safe we have taken the following precautions;

- Hand sanitisers located at the entrance to the centre and in each room
- 2 metres spacing of all activities
- Risk Assessments regularly updated after each fresh government announcement
- Regular fogging (sanitising) of all spaces
- Increased cleaning and sanitisation before and after each session
- All organisers of activities ensure that they all have their own risk assessments and also ensure that only those who have pre booked places can attend.
- Strict limits have also been placed on the number of attendees at each session to ensure that social distancing can take place.

Useful COVID-19 Resources

COVID Testing for people with symptoms

The easiest way to get a Covid test is via the online government website www.gov.uk/get-coronavirus-test If you have difficulties using the online service then you can call 119 between the hours of 7am to 11pm

COVID Testing for people without symptoms (for eligible people only)

Cheshire West and Chester Local Authority has been provided with Lateral Flow tests which allow for results to be provided within 30 mins of the test. The testing centres are currently aimed at eligible groups. These groups include those who work with vulnerable people, people who provide unpaid support to family or friends who could not manage without their help and people who cannot work from home and come into contact with others. Unfortunately, at present, the centres cannot test people under the age of 18. You do not need an appointment to get tested. You can arrive at a time that suits you - although if the test centre is busy you may have to queue.

The test centres are open from 9am to 7pm from Monday to Friday, and from 9am to 1pm on Saturdays. The local sites are;




