KINGSLEY PARISH HOUSING NEEDS SURVEY

In the January edition of Kingsley News we advised that a questionnaire would be distributed around March to gather your views on the provision of affordable housing in the Parish and establish the degree of need for affordable housing from people with a local connection to the Parish.

The Questionnaire is in two parts. We would like everyone to please complete the six questions in Part One as your views are greatly appreciated. If you or any member of your household wish to be considered for any possible affordable housing scheme in the future please complete Part Two as well.

Affordable housing is property provided for people (that meet specific criteria) who can't afford to buy or rent a property because of high property prices or high rental prices even though they would like to remain in an area.

The type of housing that might be made available includes shared ownership properties and reduced cost rental properties. Agreements are put in place to help ensure properties remain affordable in the future.

Rural affordable schemes are small scale not large scale developments. We are typically looking at up to around 12 properties on individual sites.

Instructions for returning completed questionnaires are on the form. The information provided by you will be collated to give a set of statistics and will only be used in this anonymous form.

If the results of the Survey prove a significant level of need within the area then the Parish Council will discuss the matter with Vale Royal Borough Council, consult with the community and liaise with appropriate housing associations in an attempt to progress this initiative. Any new homes will be for local people

and those with a local connection who are in housing need.

Funded by DEFRA (Department of Environment, Food and Rural Affairs), Phil is this region's Rural Housing Enabler whose role is to advise on rural affordable housing.

Change of Name for Top Road?

Fellow residents of Top Road may be wondering what happened to the petition which 85% of us signed suggesting a change of name back to Top Lane. The letter from Vale Royal's Department of Planning and Building Control which I received in November in reply to the petition was not encouraging. I quote from the letter from a Mrs Glenys Atherton :

“Before consultations begin I would like to outline the implication of your proposal.

We need to ascertain if all the residents are aware of the costs and effort that will be required of them. It would be each householder's responsibility to amend all documents relating to their property, deeds would require officially changing. Royal Mail charge for redirection of mail etcetera, the costs that this incurs will have to be met by the residents.

There is also an extra cost to residents. As from 1 April 2007 charges have been introduced for street naming and numbering. The charge for re-naming a street where requested by residents is a one off payment of £112-00 plus £36-00 per property. Will the residents who have signed the petition also be willing to incur the costs of the residents who are not in agreement for this change? I have asked the engineers department for a guideline on the cost of removing the existing street name plate and the installation of two new street name plates, they have informed met would be £200- £300-00 a cost that would have to be met by the residents.’

I have replied to this letter, pointing out that we have a problem not of our making, and feel that the Local Authority might try to help solve it, rather than make it as difficult as possible. The charges were not mentioned at all when I first wrote in January, 2006.

In reply the suggestion has been made that the road nameplate could be altered to include the word KINGSLEY. I can't see that would prevent people from going to Frodsham, but I presume at least we would not be charged for the alteration.

The suggested 'costs and effort' involved, apart from these charges, are not so huge as implied. I am told that altering deeds does not involve any more than writing a letter to the Land Registry, or putting one with your will if your

property is not registered. Change of address is something we have to manage if we move house.

Perhaps other residents who have views on the matter could communicate them to Mrs G Atherton at Wyvern House, The Drumber, Winsford, CW7 1AH, and maybe also speak to Ralph Oultram, our District Councillor.

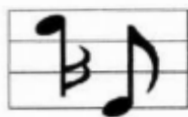

The February meeting was held in the Community Centre on 6th February. In the absence of the President and Secretary, Mrs Margaret Wadsworth chaired the meeting with Mrs Joan Booth Acting Secretary. Among the announcements were details of the Quiz Team's next contest on 19 February at Frodsham Community Centre, a St George's Day Concert on 23 April at 7.30 p.m. in Winsford Civic Hall with Weaver Valley WI Choir, a daytime Group Workshop at Frodsham Community Centre on April 25, the Group Darts Match on 12 March at Helsby, and on 28 May at Frodsham Community Centre Marie Dickson will talk about the life of Marie Lloyd.

The end of slavery and the cotton famine brought about a decline in Liverpool's fortunes, but it revived with the building of passenger liners and for a time was the most important port in the Empire. Apart from the container port, shipping has declined. Mrs Johnson went on to tell us that the Capital of Culture scheme has encouraged new industries and development. Among the events planned for the year: a new museum is to open on the waterfront, the Philharmonic Orchestra and Choir are having celebrations, a new shopping precinct is opening, and the Tall Ships will be in the Albert Dock in July . An exciting year is ahead. Mrs Hilary Pickett gave the vote of thanks.

Despite all those threats of angry weather, the sun shone for us on 2nd February and the crowds rolled in, eager for bargains, which they got!; and in the process raised £625 for the Brick Children School in Nepal - a magnificent result.

Thanks to all villagers who put in such sterling work on and before the day, sorting, selling and clearing away the remains.

WHO ARE THE BRICK CHILDREN?

The Brick Children School at Tikathali, Nepal, established in 2001 is a UK charity managed in Nepal by the Rotary Club, the Red Cross, the Village Development Committee and the school staff and parents. The school gives 150 children aged 5-14 years, from poor illiterate Himalayan families an education, food and water, medical checks and school uniforms.

All this happens in the childrens' limited breaks from work. The children come down into the Kathmandu valley to produce bricks by hand in primitive conditions. It's heavy work making the bricks and taking them on hods to the firing kilns. They live in temporary huts with no power, sanitation or water supply.

The Brick Children School is The Hurst Methodist Church's outreach project for April 2007 to March 2008. You are welcome to join us at The Hurst on Tuesday 4th March at 7.45pm for a hotpot supper and project update by a director of the charity, David Phoenix.

Meeting held on 19th February 2008

Traffic and Transport

This months meeting was attended by Mr R Brookes, Chief Engineer (Highways) at Cheshire County Council, to answer questions raised by members of the Council with regards to issues on Highways. The main issues raised were the safety of Kingsley County Primary School, speed limits and parking in the area; Dark Lane with regards to its unsuitability for HGVs; the safety of Kingsley Road, Norley Road and Mill Lane speed limits. There will be a review this year into the safety of all A and B roads in Cheshire.

County Councillor

Mrs Nora Dolphin attended the meeting and reaffirmed that Cheshire is one of the Top achieving Councils in the Country under the Government Audit. 2008 will be Cheshire 'Year of the Garden' It is hoped this will become an annual tourism event and will involve gardens opening to the public and other committee projects. There is funding available. Kingsley is hosting the 'Kingsley Garden Trail' in June, organised by the Garden Club. Who have also arranged for Gardeners Question Time on Radio 4 to come to Kingsley Community Centre on 19th May 2008.

Playing Field Report

The Consultation Evening on the playing area was a success as we were able to address any concerns of the nearby residents. The equipment won approval and it is expected the project will go ahead some time later in the year. A number of trees need removing before birds start nesting.

Cemetery Report

The railings have been repaired. And the Council is looking into the feasibility of finding a matching piece of rail for where the old entrance used to be. Some pruning has taken place.

Footpath Report

The new leaflet showing the footpaths in Kingsley nearing completion prior to going to print and will be on sale soon. The Nab footpath is very muddy and dangerously slippery and needs either hardcore or drainage. Public Rights of Way have been alerted.

Community Pride

There has been a lot of help in the village recently which has been fantastic. Many volunteers helped with clearing the Brook,, so thanks to all those who helped in clearing the Brook and with the litterpicks. The village is looking much better for this effort and Vale Royal BC have now given us more equipment.


