### KINGSLEY WALKERS



Still with a heavy heart from the passing of Dave Wood we carry on with the walks programme for 2025. The early morning of the January 28th walk day saw a very late flurry of WhatsApp messages, emails and phone calls as the walk leader called in to say she was unable to make it. However, thanks to her able deputy Sue and the resilience and flexibility of the group we felt able to proceed. There were some further disturbances as different satnav problems saw us scattered slightly across Cheshire as we tried to drive to the start point but we finally managed to coalesce and set off along the Salt Line Path near Sandbach.

Apparently 150 years ago the area was a hive of bustling industry, based on salt. The Sandbach to Wheelock branch of the North Staffordshire Railway line, opened in 1852 to carry coal and limestone to the salt works. A passenger service also ran daily to take people to the market at Sandbach but it closed in 1966. Though our day started fairly grey it was a very pleasant walk through farmland and woodlands, with streams, pools and rough grassland.

There were a few sections along quiet country roads and we returned to the car park along the towpath of the Trent and Mersey Canal. Meanwhile our erstwhile leader floated in a torpor of heavy duty painkillers on a hospital trolley. Thankfully her condition turns out to be very treatable and we send our very best wishes for a speedy recovery.

Early February saw us again use a section of disused industrial trackbed, this time the old Lever Railway branching off the mainline towards Port Sunlight and Bromborough on the Wirral. Aside from that the walk took us through some residential areas and then provided views across the Mersey from Eastham Country Park. The dense woods and torpid, muddy river waters of Dibbinsdale Country Park conjured up echoes of banjo music and images of the 1972 film Deliverance but 12 of us emerged unscathed and cheerful for a very pleasant lunch at the Pesto Restaurant where we had parked.

"Never work with dogs or children" it is said.

However, the Kingsley Players did just that in their recent production of "Annie". The result was a well performed musical that provided the audience with splendid entertainment. The dog, "Sandy" (aka "Petal"), and the children all played their parts impeccably, possibly stealing the show at times!



The play tells the story of "Little Orphan Annie", (played beautifully by Rachel Horton) who was left on the doorstep of a New York orphanage in 1922. The musical begins in 1933 when America was in the depths of the Great Depression. Millions were unemployed and many were homeless. Whilst few were able to keep hold of their wealth, industrialist Oliver Warbucks (Phil Murray) was a successful millionaire.

To many of his critics he appeared cold and unfeeling, so to try to soften his image, it was decided he should take in an orphan for Christmas. His secretary, Grace (Lisa Buckley) chose Annie. The story has its twists and turns, but with an eventual happy ending, for all except the villains! And what brilliant villains they were thanks to the strong performances of Louise Steggals, Paul Horton and Beverley Ross. The other members of the cast provided excellent performances too, in numerous roles from the homeless living in "Hoovervilles" to the servants of Warbucks and the genial President Roosevelt.

Much credit must go to the enthusiastic "orphans" who kept the energy flowing throughout! The music and choreography was of the usual high standard audiences have come to expect from the Players, as were the lighting, costumes, set and stage management.

All in all a bright spot in the middle of a dull February. Many thanks to the director Valerie Ball and her excellent team.

### KINGSLEY PARISH COUNCIL



The Parish Council met on Tuesday 18th February 2025, at Kingsley Community Centre. There were eight members of the public present.

Three members of the public spoke about speeding drivers on Norley Road B5152, and in particular the stretch from the Hollow Lane junction through to Top Road junction including Guest Slack. The speakers highlighted a very recent serious accident due to high speed driving. The speakers requested that the Parish Council raise this issue with CWaC Highways, and in particular the lack of signs indicating the permissible speed (there being only two 50mph signs along the whole stretch of road). The Council undertook to write to CWaC asking them to investigate both the lack of signage and speeding drivers with a view to reducing the permitted speed on that section of road. The Council will also raise the matter with our Borough Councillor Hugo Deynam.

With regards to Waterloo Lane, the Council had received correspondence from CWaC Highways, stating that on a recent visit by an officer, there was no evidence of speeding, or, of illegal / inconvenient parking on right angled bend at the end of Waterloo Lane. Highways advised that they would not be pursuing the matter further. CWaC also repeated their previous statement that if the residents wished to provide speed signage, then Kingsley Parish Council would have to cover a significant part of the cost.

The Council, through our Borough Councillor, have agreed to undertake training of a number of Councillors on speed monitoring devices. This will allow us to borrow a community speed monitoring device and undertake our own surveys around the village. Our PCSO Neil Flannigan will provide the training.

The Council was able to report that FACTCO had confirmed in writing, that they had returned to the lay-by area on the B5152 and the top of Dark Lane, and had cleared all remaining debris and equipment from the area.

Cllr Owen has confirmed that the Village Tidy Up day will be going ahead on Saturday 22nd March, between 9.30 and 12.30, and that he will be posting further information and updates on Facebook, so please keep an eye out. United Utilities (who are currently undertaking the upgrade works to the Vyrnwy Aqueduct in and around Kingsley) have said they will provide volunteer members of staff to assist in the work. Please remember that as part of this work day there will also be a village litter pick. The Council will be providing bags and grabs, but if anyone has the equipment from the original litter picking team, can you please bring this along, thank you!

The Council discussed the future provision of a village Christmas Tree. To have an impact the tree needs to be around 12 to 15 feet high. In previous years, the erection and lighting of the tree has relied on a small number of Parish Councillors. Such a sized tree is a considerable weight and awkward to handle on a busy road and across a public footpath. As a number of Councillors are now "senior citizens" and the remaining "younger" Councillors all work, it is becoming impossible to erect the tree without the kind help and assistance of DD Forestry who supply and deliver the tree. The Council is now considering a number of options to overcome this issue, from providing a number of smaller trees , to planting living trees that will mature, to possibly doing away with a Christmas tree and instead provide illuminated decorations in its place. Clearly costs are a significant issue that will need to be considered, the Council will report back in due course.

Our Borough Councillor Hugo Deynam, highlighted a survey that is open to all residents on the CWaC website, seeking your views on the HGV traffic passing through our village and other villages in the County. Please take a look at this and have your say, these vehicles are damaging our roads and causing major obstructions along Hollow Lane, particularly at the narrow part near St John's Church.

The Council has appointed Northwich Town Council (NTC) works department to excavate and repair the large dip in the playing field footpath adjacent to the Basketball net. We have requested that they try to determine the cause of the subsidence and rectify this prior to infilling.

NTC have also been appointed to undertake the remaining jet washing of the children's play area, and are also undertaking refurbishment of a number of benches around the village.

Due to the use of the Community Centre by Kingsley Youth Theatre on our usual third Tuesday meeting date, the Council has agreed to move the next meeting to the 11th March 2025. The Council has further agreed to amend two further meeting dates later in the year due to use of the Centre by Kingsley Players. These revised dates are: 13th May (instead of the 20th) and 28th October 2025 (instead of the 21st).



# Weaver Words Literature Festival is Back! New Line-Up is announced.

Comedy legend Jenny Eclair, BBC TV presenter Louise Minchin and poet Lemn Sissay head an impressive line-up of talks, events, workshops and writing competitions at Cheshire's seventh Weaver Words Literature Festival, based at Frodsham Community Centre, **Saturday 3 - Sunday 11 May 2025.** 

Gerald Dickens, great great grandson of the famous author Charles Dickens, returns to give a stunning one man show telling the story of his famous relative's novel, Nicholas Nickleby. We will explore the 'Future of the Media' with four experts from social media, print, broadcast and academia leading a fascinating debate into the recent impact of artificial intelligence, fake news and the digital Wild West.

The theme this year is 'A Celebration of Cheshire', with a focus on great Cestrian literary connections, from Lewis Carroll to Elizabeth Gaskell, plus new Cheshire writers aiming to make their mark.

Weaver Words patron Tim Firth will be guest speaker at a literary dinner in Frodsham's Main Street Kitchen restaurant, as well as providing musical entertainment at the Gala Evening, with poet Lynn Pegler, before the announcement of the Flash Fiction Competition winners.

For young children (aged 4-8), there's a chance to enjoy fantastic cartoon stories and games with award-winning authors Natalie Reeves Billing and Jude Lennon in Animates Action Stations! And for adults there will again be an array of creative workshops on offer, from poetry

writing with Jean Atkin aboard the impressive Danny Steamship, moored at the Anderton Boat Lift, to sessions on flash fiction with David Gaffney, journal writing with Julia McGuinness and children's picture books with Iryna Garkusha (Ira Bova).

Festival manager Lynn Pegler said: "We're delighted to have assembled a fantastic line-up for Frodsham's seventh literature festival.

"Our theme of 'Celebrating Cheshire' has provided inspiration for several wonderful events, including a tour to Lewis Carroll's birthplace in Daresbury, afternoon tea in the company of Mrs Elizabeth Gaskell and author Nell Stevens, and a fascinating look at the county's role in the English Civil War and how this plays into historical fiction.

"We are grateful to all our sponsors and partners for their kind support and to the dedicated volunteers who give their time and expertise to bring Weaver Words to life."

Sponsored by Encirc glass manufacturers, RSK (Helsby), Main Street Kitchen and Rotary, the festival will again feature two creative writing competitions.

£500 prize money is on offer for authors of the best new adult flash fiction story (under 300 words) and for local children (aged 7-14), the Great Weaver Words Writing Prize provides £300 worth of prizes, judged by festival patron Tim Firth. ## ...... why churches take a collection each Sunday?

Looking back at the Hurst, historically, back in 1819 "pew rents" were initiated.

Presumably this was to guarantee you a seat in church! These were paid at Michaelmas, 29th September, annually, or could be paid quarterly.

In 1900, 25 people paid for 95 seats. By 1910, this was down to 18 people. In 1925, only 2 people paid up!! In 1930, only 1, and the scheme was dropped.

From 1877 onwards, most of the Hurst's collections on Sundays were given away e.g. Methodist Missionary Fund, Home Missions, Kingswood school locally, the Theological College, the "Worn Out Ministers' Fund"! (Ministers' and Widows Fund), the Education Fund and the Chapel Fund.

Today, at the Hurst, the collection is taken to cover costs – we are required to pay an "Assessment" every year to our Circuit, basically to pay the wages of our minister and to have access to a number of administrative groups and their advice etc. This has for some time been in the late £20,000s. We also pay for repairs and upkeep to the church building, organ tuning and running costs generally.

There are weeks in the year where there is an envelope on the chair in church where you can give an extra payment to a specific cause if you so wish e.g. MHA (Methodist Homes for the Aged) Chapelfields in Frodsham is an example, Christian Aid, World and Home Missions, "Action for Children".

At the Hurst, we hold fundraising events throughout the whole of the year. These are not for Church Funds, but for specific charities, as stated in a previous article. We concentrate on a different "charity of the year" every year and then we will occasionally raise money for a charity in the news, or one brought to our attention locally.
