# The Importance of Being Earnest 21- 24 May, 2025



Award-winning Kingsley Players are back on stage in May with Oscar Wilde's much-loved, brilliantly witty play **'The Importance of Being Earnest'**.

A cast of nine talented actors will perform the farcical comedy following the tangled affairs of two young men about town, who lead double lives in a complicated charade to avoid unwanted social obligations.

First performed in 1895, it was Wilde's final play before he was imprisoned in Reading Gaol for 'gross indecency'. It was revived in 1909 and has now come to be regarded as one of the greatest stage comedies of all time.

Director Carole Shinkfield, who is a regular director and actor with Frodsham Players, is making her first appearance in Kingsley after gaining an MA in directing at Manchester's Arden Theatre School.

She explained: "I decided to set the play during the 1930s, as it was a period of great change for the upper classes. Although the play's main characters are the 'bright young things' who lived through the Roaring Twenties, the rumblings in Europe are still at the outer reaches of their vision.

"Wilde cleverly mocks the hypocrisy, superficiality and trivial concerns of the privileged gentry, illustrated in the beautifully crafted character of Lady Bracknell. Despite the numerous productions that have been around over the last year, I hope we can still bring something new to Wilde's extraordinary piece of writing."

'The Importance of Being Earnest' will be on stage at Kingsley Theatre in Kingsley Community Centre, from Wednesday 21 to Saturday 24 May 2025, nightly at 7.30pm.

## The "In-Between" Time

Already we are in the month of May and Easter seems as far away as ever. This month is busy with VE Day 80 on the 8<sup>th</sup> and Christian Aid week  $11^{th} - 17^{th}$  May. Then at the end of the month we celebrate Ascension Day.

On the first Ascension Day the disciples find themselves bereft of the one who has captivated them, given their lives significance, meaning and purpose and stimulated within them a passion for the Kingdom of God.

They feel like abandoned orphans, as their beloved Lord evaporates from their sight into the great, blue yonder. They are at a loss to know what to do next. For the moment they are caught in what might be called the 'in-between' time. They're caught between the Ascension and Pentecost - between loss and promise.

There are times when we find ourselves in a situation not dissimilar to that of the disciples, between things we have lost and things that have not yet unfolded.

This is not dissimilar to the situation as a Benefice we find ourselves in. We are relieved on one hand that the vacancy for an incumbent is soon to be advertised but on the other hand perhaps a little apprehensive, a fear of the unknown.

There is something comforting about putting our trust in God as we pray that he has this, let us be patient and remember we are in God's time and not our own.

# RUNCORN & HELSBY BY-ELECTION - 1 MAY 2025

On Thursday, 1 May 2025, the Runcorn and Helsby constituency in Cheshire will hold a parliamentary by-election to elect a new Member of Parliament. This by-election was triggered by the resignation of Mike Amesbury, who stepped down following a suspended sentence for assault.

#### A Crowded Field of Candidates

Fifteen candidates are contesting the seat, reflecting a diverse political landscape:

- Labour Party: Karen Shore, Deputy Leader of Cheshire West and Chester Council, aims to retain the seat for Labour.
- Reform UK: Sarah Pochin, a former Conservative councillor and mayor of Cheshire East, represents Reform UK. Her candidacy is central to Reform UK's strategy to gain a parliamentary foothold.
- Conservative Party: Sean Houlston is the Conservative candidate.
- Liberal Democrats: Paul Duffy stands for the Liberal Democrats.
- Green Party: Chris Copeman is the Green Party candidate.

Other Parties and Independents: Candidates include Catherine Blaiklock (English Democrat), Peter Ford (Workers Party), Danny Clarke (Liberal Party), Howling Laud Hope (Monster Raving Loony), Jason Philip Hughes (Volt), Alan McKie and Michael Williams (Independents), Graham Harry Moore (English Constitution), Paul Andrew Murphy (SDP), and John Stevens (Rejoin EU).

#### **Political Significance**

This by-election is significant as it tests the popularity of the major parties and the rising influence of smaller parties like Reform UK. Labour's performance will be closely watched, given the circumstances leading to the by-election. Reform UK's campaign, led by Nigel Farage, aims to capitalize on voter dissatisfaction with traditional parties.

#### **Voting Information**

Polling will take place on Thursday, 1 May 2025, from 7 am to 10 pm. The Polling Station for Kingsley residents will be held at Kingsley Community Centre.Voters are reminded to bring valid photo ID, as required under current electoral regulations.

This initiative is part of a broader four-day celebration that includes a military procession, an RAF flypast in central London, the lighting of 2,500 beacons across the UK, and a televised party at Horse Guards Parade on 8 May.

# KINGSLEY WALKERS (herding cats)



In the past our normal routine of countryside walks has been punctuated by the odd walking tours of towns and cities. We have visited Manchester and Liverpool, learning about history, culture and landmarks, combining that with healthy exercise. In the autumn a visit to Shrewsbury (Shroesbury, Shroosbury, choose your pronunciation) had been planned and then hurriedly substituted with Chester as most of the planned route was submerged under Severn feet of Storm Bert flood water at the time.

The spring has bought some fine weather and March 25th was no exception. Shrewsbury Park and Ride scheme was used with the intention of reducing the stress of driving and parking in a city centre. It is however amazing how quickly members of a group can disperse to supermarket toilets and cash machines if they think they have a few minutes before the bus.

The highlights of our walk were:-

- Shrewsbury Castle with lovely gardens and elevated views over the city.
- The Church of St Mary with stained glass windows from various ages and with informative church volunteers to hand.
- The riverside gardens and The Dingle ponds and flowerbeds, a fitting tribute, even more than the blue plaque, to Percy Thrower, who became the youngest ever city Superintendent of Parks and Gardens at the age of 32 in 1946.
- A lunch opposite the memorial to Charles Darwin who had attended the famous city school.
- A looping walk around the cricket ground and grassed areas of Mountfields.
- The public school, placed high above the city and affording great views but not affordable for many.
- The Abbey, founded in 1083 but with some Saxon antecedents containing various forms of architectural feature from its varied history but which had suffered under Henry the Eighth, well known for his dissolution.

The river was our constant companion and we crossed it four times by the Welsh Bridge (x2), Kingsland Bridge, the English Bridge and finally Castle Walk Footbridge before passing under the railway bridge as we came to the end. I am optimistic that we retained many of our original participants despite the distractions of the city, our groping down narrow lanes, the lure of cafes, the need for comfort breaks, 3 brothers catching up with each other but not always the group and the many other directional and conversational tangents. In all, it was an excellent day.

On April 8th, we enjoyed glorious weather, a 5 mile walk through some country parks on the Wirral and fabulous views from Thurstaston Hill over Liverpool and Wales. This was despite the best efforts of the group leader to lose himself on the local motorway system en route to the walk start. It was rounded off with an enjoyable pub lunch at the Irby Mill.

# When Will it Stop Raining?



Twelve months ago, we were asking "When will it stop raining?" as we were reporting that we had 196% of our long-term average rainfall in February 2024 and 160% in the three winter months from December 2023 to February 2024. This winter, rainfall in the Northwest has been more in line with long term averages, but...

How things change!

In March 2025, rainfall across the Northwest has been 21% of the long-term average, in line with the statistic for the England and Wales as a whole, though in Cheshire we may have had somewhat more than this: the driest parts of the Northwest being in Cumbria. Other parts of the country have been drier, with the Southeast and Southwest having only 11% of the long-term average.

River flows have been variable: in the River Weaver, water flow is currently normal, but in the River Dee, water flows are exceptionally low.

The brightest weather news is sunshine! March 2025 was England's sunniest and Northern England's third sunniest March since records began in 2010 with 59% more sunshine than the long-term average.





Cheshire's inspiring landmarks and intriguing history come under the spotlight in an exciting new collection of poems and images by local writer Lynn Pegler.


Around Cheshire in 100 Poems and Pictures takes readers on a visual and literary journey of discovery, exploring familiar features and hidden corners from a fresh perspective.


