

#### KINGSLEY RESIDENT BECOMES

### GUINESS WORLD RECORD HOLDER

Lisa Easton, a dedicated runner from Kingsley, Cheshire, completed her third London Marathon on 27 April 2025, raising funds for the British Heart Foundation (BHF). Motivated by personal experience—her son was born with a congenital heart condition—Lisa aimed to give back to the organisation that supported her family during challenging times.

Balancing her role as a senior leader and PE Teacher at a secondary school in Wrexham with rigorous training, Lisa demonstrated remarkable commitment. Her preparation involved early morning runs, late-night jogs, and long weekend runs, all on a tread milll in her garage!

This year, Lisa took time to appreciate London's iconic landmarks, making the experience both personally fulfilling and memorable. Her fundraising efforts were supported by the local community, including events like the charity quiz night night in Kingsley featuring food, music, and raffles.



Lisa is now also a Guinness World Record holder. The 2025 TCS London Marathon didn't just make headlines—it made history. On April 27, a record-breaking 56,640 runners crossed the finish line, officially earning the event a Guinness World Record for the most marathon finishers ever. This figure surpasses the previous record of 55,646 set by the 2024 New York City Marathon, and cements London's status as a global hub for distance running.

The achievement is about more than numbers. It's a celebration of perseverance, community, and inclusivity. From elite competitors chasing world records to thousands of everyday people running for causes close to their hearts, the marathon brought together a remarkably diverse crowd. Participants came from over 120 countries, representing every background, age group, and motivation imaginable.

According to organizers, more than 840,000 people applied to enter the 2025 race—also a world record for the most applications to a marathon. After months of training, anticipation, and buildup, more than 58,000 runners started the race. Of those, a record-setting 56,640 crossed the finish line on The Mall, just past Buckingham Palace.



Event Director Hugh Brasher called the day "a landmark in the history of running." He added, "What makes this record so powerful is not just the size of the number—it's the scale of the human stories behind it. Every finisher overcame something to get here, and together, they've shown what's possible."

The day wasn't just about breaking records. It was also about world-class performances. Ethiopia's Tigst Assefa claimed victory in the women's elite race, setting a new women-only world record with a time of 2:15:50. In the men's division, Kenya's Sebastian Sawe stormed to a win with 2:02:27, one of the fastest marathon times ever recorded in London.

Meanwhile, the charity impact of the race was just as massive. Early figures suggest that more than £70 million was raised for a wide range of causes, from cancer research to mental health services. For many participants, fundraising was just as important as finishing.

Lisa's journey underscores the impact of combining personal passion with charitable causes, inspiring others in her community and beyond. Her next event is The Great North Run, taking place this September. No doubt there will be another fund raising quiz night held in Kingsley Community Centre, so do look out for the advert in the Kingsley News nearer the time. If, however, you wish to donate her fundraising page is still open.



#### **Disrupting Circadian rhythms**

As the summer solstice approaches, we enjoy the lengthening hours of sunlight and yet are blessed with some hours of darkness for rest and refreshment. We spare a thought for shift-workers, whose Circadian rhythms are disrupted and give thanks for their service in upholding the fabric of our 21st-century Western society.

Night and day ... Recorded in the first book of our Christian scriptures is an ancient attempt to understand the mystery of this cycle: 'In the beginning ... darkness covered the face of the deep ... Then God said, "Let there be light"; and there was light. And God saw that the light was good; and God separated the light from the darkness. God called the light Day, and the darkness Night.' (Genesis 1:1-5)

'Light' has become a metaphor for all that is good and open and honest. Jesus Christ said, 'I am the light of the world' (John 8:12) and whatever our circumstances, we celebrate light, and can trust that light brings vision, clarity, and maybe fresh hope, such as at the dawn of each new day.

All this was put much more neatly at this year's Weaver Words festival when the poet Lemn Sissay presented his latest book which includes this poem:

'How do you do it? said night,
How do you wake and shine?
I keep it simple, said light.
One day at a time.'

2025, Canongate.

...... that the chapel at the Hurst has been 'cared for' by the Moores' family for around two thirds of its existence: Fred, who lived opposite chapel in the early part of the 20<sup>th</sup> century, followed by Brian, who grew up there, continued when his father could do no more.

It was with great sadness that not only the Hurst but MANY from the village and beyond said farewell to Brian in April this year, after a relatively short illness. We felt that he touched the lives of so many people in this community that we should give him a bit more than a mention! There were over 200 hundred people at the service of Thanksgiving for his life at the Hurst on April 29th.

He spent all his life living within 200 metres of the church and while he was 'caretaking', he would walk up to the church every day, always looking for things that needed doing and then using his skills to implement them. I put 'caretaking' in inverted commas because he was far more than a caretaker! Even last year, in 2024 he was seen up scaffolding, which he assembled himself, painting the windows outside at the age of 85! When 2 young mums with babies started attending church about 2 years ago, Brian made an area at the side of the internal space of the chapel into an enclosed area where the children could be safe playing with or without their mums, but still feeling part of the church family. He was instrumental in modernising the building: knocking down walls to create a larger meeting place at the back of chapel; removing the pulpit and pews; the Peace Garden, and modernising the porch, among other things. All of this, of course was done while working full time and being a family man. He retired early from being the Building Control Officer for Chester City Council, to look after his parents until their death.

His life at the Hurst was not just a practical one, but a spiritual one too. He felt the call to preach and, after studying the Old and New Testaments and Christian Doctrine through a correspondence course he became a local preacher for the Methodist Church in 1960 like his father before him, and served 50 years of preaching in this Circuit.

He and his wife Jean ran the Inters Guild, the Shell Group, Youth groups, and organised events to national youth events in London, midnight hikes, bonfire nights and trips to Beddgelert leading groups up Snowdon in all weather!

Brian will be missed in many, many ways by so many people. Rest in Peace, Brian.

### KINGSLEY WALKERS



On 22 April, 11 walkers travelled to Macclesfield Forest. We climbed up Shutlingsloe which has an elevation of 506m (1,660 feet). There is a good reason that it is known as The Matterhorn of Cheshire! At the top we had our coffee whilst enjoying the 360 degree panoramic view of the Cheshire countryside and The Peak District. This was also a good opportunity to get our heart rates back to normal. An adventurous scramble took us down into Wildboarclough for a picnic lunch with another fabulous view. Sadly for some, The Hanging Gate pub was closed when we walked past, leaving one or two walkers looking longingly at its charming beer garden! The walk back to the car park skirted Piggford Moor Nature Reserve. Apparently until 1990 Piggford Moor had little in the way of wildlife as it was covered with barren Molinia grass. Thanks to a heather regeneration and reseeding project and three miles of stone wall rebuilding to control grazing, the moor is now the only island of heather moor in Cheshire. Now it is home to brown hares, red grouse and upland waders like snipe, lapwing and curlew. Plus the only golden plover in the county!

On 13 May, in glorious sunshine, 10 walkers plus 1 extremely well behaved dog (good boy Charlie!) did a 5 ½ mile walk starting from The Childe of Hale pub in Hale Village. The pub takes its name from its most famous resident, John Middleton (1578-1623), who was reputed to have been 9 feet 3 inches tall and was known as The Childe of Hale. We walked past his house, where he was supposed to have slept with his feet hanging out of the window. We also saw the impressive bronze statue of him by sculptor Diane Gorvin and we visited his grave in the churchyard of St Mary's. From the lovely quirky village we headed down Within Way to the coastal path. There were great views of the Runcorn Widnes Bridge before we reached the estuary, then ever changing and interesting views as we headed towards Hale Head Lighthouse and then on towards Liverpool Airport. We saw different views of the industry on the other side of the estuary in Runcorn, then Frodsham and Helsby Hills and the Clwydian Hills in the distance. The coastal path was lovely, with swathes of wild flowers in between the path and the arable fields. We paused for a while at the airport's eastern Viewing Area 2 but the wind direction meant that planes were coming in to land from West to East so we were not able to experience the thrill of them flying over our heads which they do when the wind is in the other direction. I'm not sure who was more disappointed, some of our walkers or the three small children who were eagerly waiting. Well done to John who went into Grandad mode and lifted them up in turn so that at least they could see the EasyJet from Malaga taxiing after landing! From the Airport we walked back into Hale Village with thatched houses on both sides of the road as we approached. Then back to the pub for a well deserved and very nice lunch.
