Well, I'm back after a months break. What a lot has happened in that month. The warm dry May and June gave way to the most prolonged spell of wet weather I can ever remember. Day after day deluges of heavy rain made the land like a bog. The wheat and barley were knocked flat by the weight of the heavy rain, but worst, the potato fields were impassable for the harvester. Either the harvester or the trailers got stuck every day. We wasted so much time and effort pulling them out. Any hollows in the potato fields filled with water and the potatoes just rotted in the soil. Blight spraying has to be done every 10 days normally or every 7 days when it's really wet. Spraying intervals could not be kept and blight appeared in the crops. Once blight is established it is impossible to eradicate. Potato blight is a fungal disease that develops in the moist microclimate under the canopy of the potato tops. It appears in the leaves or stems and if untreated, gradually works its way down to the tubers, which then rot and turn to mush. If spraying does not control blight, we have to desiccate all the green tops and kill them off. This leads to yield loss if the crop is immature.

Suddenly at the end of July it stopped raining and turned warm and dry. We started combining our Winter Barley on a hot day and promptly got the combine stuck in a wet hollow. After much swearing under breath, we managed to pull it out. The combine weighs over 20 tonne when empty, so it was not easy. After that, the barley and oil seed rape harvest went comparatively smoothly. Oil seed rape yields have been very good, and with more demand from the bio fuel industry, combined with poor yields in Europe, the price has gone much higher than last year. Prices of all cereals have improved dramatically over the last 6 months to levels I have not seen before.

The reasons for the high prices are complex but it is a combination of 1. Less grains from USA and Canada is available to export because considerably more is going to ethanol production in US.
2. Poor harvests in Eastern Europe and Spain due to the exceptionally hot summer they have had.

3. Much greater demand from China. With a quarter of the worlds population they have become wealthier, and so can afford a more Western diet, so more grains are needed to feed them and the animals they eat. China is now an importer of cereals rather than an exporter

4. Consumption of cereals is greater than production again this year, which has finally exhausted world stocks

Bread bakers, brewers and other food manufacturers are trying to use the higher prices as an excuse to push up their product prices to the consumer. Be very wary of this excuse. The price of the wheat in an average loaf of bread is only 6 –8 pence.

In the middle of the wet spell in July, the PR representative from the NFU came to visit us to see how the wet weather was affecting our harvesting. When he arrived, he announced he had arranged for ITV News to come along as well, to film a piece for the ITV Lunchtime News! After an initial panic attack, we decided to reverse the Potato Harvester into a particularly wet spot in the field until it sunk and then filmed the interview ankle deep in mud. Later, we all squeezed into our sitting room with great anticipation, to watch the lunchtime news and there we were, our one and a half minutes of fame – Blink and you would have missed it. It surprised us how many people had seen it, judging by the amount of stick we got. Do these people not do anything during the day!!! The NFU have also done a report. This is available to see on www.nfuonline.com - northwest – regional news – ‘Waterlogged fields wipe out Cheshire Farmers Crop’.

But wait, dry your eyes!!

Before you start a collection or send us donations to the Poor Potato Farmers Fund – during mid August, we have been back on to the wet fields and have harvested most potatoes that we had left, with very few losses.

Mid August saw the start of the wheat harvest. With the high prices this year, it is even more important that every grain is collected into the stores. So what does our head tractor driver do? – he managed to accidentally tip a trailer full of wheat into a roadside ditch, losing half

the load. He is very embarrassed about this so I will not name him. Many thanks must go to Mark Avis and Paul Gittins who came to our rescue with a JCB digger to pull the tractor and trailer out and try to scoop some of the wheat out of the water and weeds.

Oil seed rape sowing is about to commence. Oil seed rape really is a 12-month crop, but it's raining again, so it's back to the paperwork.

The recent foot and mouth outbreak seems to have been contained in the South East. This gave us all a fright and although it did not affect us directly, all cattle movements and markets have been suspended until further notice.

Thanks to everyone who has been dropping their egg boxes off. We are recycling them at the Frodsham Farm.

To see if anyone actually reads this or is paying attention, I thought I would introduce a Q & A section at the end of each month's edition. Please e-mail any questions to me, and I will attempt to answer them the following month.

- We were very proud to officially achieve Healthy School Accreditation across the Federation in June and celebrate the award with an informative evening at the school to share our work that had contributed towards it. The president suggested that the proceeds from the coffee morning could be used to subsidise a dinner, with speaker, in January.

This is a charitable organisation, based in Sussex, which runs a school for training dogs to help people with a variety of disabilities. The training can take up to three years and the prospective "partner" has to be involved for at least three periods during those three years. Miriam is wheelchair bound and had with her her brown Labrador called Kruger who can do such tasks as opening doors, emptying the washer, picking up objects, taking off gloves and hats and helping with shopping by putting goods from the shelf into a basket and even paying for them if necessary. It was a fascinating talk which made us realise how much more than just love and companionship dogs have to offer their human partners.

There is no meeting in August. The talk for the next meeting on Sept 5th is entitled "Hatched, Matched and Dispatched".


