IMPORTANT PUBLIC CONSULTATION EVENT – THE ERECTION OF RENTED AFFORDABLE DWELLINGS FOR LOCAL RESIDENTS – 23rd SEPTEMBER 2009

Plus Dane Housing Group, McInerney Homes and Kingsley Parish Council have been working on proposals to deliver high quality affordable homes within the village of Kingsley

3 sites have been identified as being suitable for the construction of affordable housing. One off Pike Lane, which has been identified as the preferred site by Kingsley Parish Council, and others off Chapel Lane and Westbrook Road. There is a need to deliver affordable accommodation in order to address the identified and pressing accommodation requirements for local people.

The development will address clearly identified and supported housing needs in the village of Kingsley. It is vital that this opportunity to provide valuable affordable housing is not missed.

The purpose of the consultation is to engage with the residents of Kingsley, taking comments on board about the scheme, and answering questions as well as addressing any concerns. There will be an opportunity to comment directly on the layout of the new housing site, and the developer is keen to take on board any design ideas which may be put forward.

The event will take place on the 23rd September at 3pm – 6pm in the Kingsley Community Centre at the end of Smithy Lane.

Members of the Parish Council will be present, along with representatives from Plus Dane Housing Group, McInerney Homes, Mosaic Town Planning as well as the Rural Housing Enabler, Phil Addison.

We hope that residents of Kingsley will support the event, and our proposals. Your involvement is essential in delivering the best possible development for Kingsley.

It has become apparent recently that there has been a number of distraction burglaries reported to Cheshire Police. Trading Standards would like to pass on this information in order that the public keep vigilant at all times.

On each occasion callers posing as Water Board Officials have tried to gain access to properties on the pretence of needing to check water pressure. One resident who allowed the bogus caller entry to her property has since found a substantial amount of money missing.

Please be on your guard against this type of crime. Use your door chain and ask to see photographic identification. You can check the callers validity by contacting United Utilities on 0845 7462200.(Dee Valley Water 01978 846946) No genuine caller will mind waiting while you do this.

If you have any doubts whatsoever do not allow access and contact the Police immediately. If in any doubt KEEP THEM OUT.



Frodsham and District Roundtable

has recently come to the aid of a local Autistic child living in Kingsley. Jack Armstrong regressed at 3.5 years old and previous to that Jack was delayed in speech. When Jack regressed he lost all his speech, stopped making eye contact and no longer played with any of his toys. Nor did he want to be near others, including other children - all Jack wanted to do was shut himself off in his own world.

In October last year, Jacks mother, Natalie, found out about the Sonrise programme in America which provides intensive therapy and training with proven results. Several volunteers currently assist Mum and Dad, Natalie and Mark, in following the initial Sonrise programme with Jack and since January Jack has gained some single words and his eye-contact has greatly improved, as has his interaction both with the volunteers and family members.

Natalie and Mark have also converted a room at home to specifically work with and play with Jack.

To continue the progress made so far Natalie and Mark are organising fund raising events to secure a place for Jack at the Sonrise Treatment Centre in America, so he can continue to move forward to a normal life.

The cost for a one week Intensive Program is \$18,400, with an immediate deposit of \$3000.00 to secure a place for Jack. This is when Frodsham Roundtable came to Jacks aid – Chairman Martin Sadler – 'In terms of our charity work, this is exactly what Round tabling is all about, assisting local good causes within our community. We felt so strongly about Natalie and Marks dilemma that we agreed to donate £2,200 to ensure that Jack is able secure a place/date for the Sonrise treatment. In addition to this, members have also agreed to try to assist further in the future by organising a special 'coast to coast' cycle ride to raise funds specifically for Jacks cause - this will take place mid year 2010'
